

Sandoz ESOT Study Grants: Transplantation Call for Applications

Sandoz Pharma Ltd. offers annual study grants totaling SFr. 40 000.– to individuals involved in the clinical or experimental fields of transplantation. Each study has to be performed in a country situated in Europe that is not the country in which the applicant is currently working. There will have to be a specific purpose with a clear study goal. The period for which an applicant may apply for financial support can vary from one to several weeks or months. Congress visits will be excluded from any study grant. The Council of the European Society for Organ Transplantation (E.S.O.T.) will administer the Sandoz ESOT Study Grants. The selection and final decision will be made by the Council. Applications must be in English, should specify the purpose of the study, and should be supported with relevant documentation, including a full curriculum vitae. The application must be signed by the head of the department/program where the study will take place. Neither the heads of the departments nor the applicant necessarily has to be a member of E.S.O.T.

To all regular members of ESOT

Dear Colleague,

At the last ESOT meeting in Maastricht in 1991, the members of the European Liver Club (an informal association of those interested in liver transplantation) discussed the formation of a liver transplantation section within the ESOT organization.

A steering committee chaired by Professor Sir Roy Calne was elected to decide on the objectives, membership, and specific arrangements and to prepare the formal constitution of the section.

Other members of the Committee are: Dr. D. Alfani, Prof. H. Bismuth, Prof. C. Brölsch, Dr. K. Höckerstedt, Prof. D. Houssin, Dr. P. Kalinski, Dr. F. Mühlbacher, Prof. J. B. Otte, and Mr. Keith Rolles.

The Steering Committee met in Cambridge on 14 December 1991 and a general assembly of the Liver Club was convened on 20 August 1992, during the Paris meeting.

We would like to provide you with the following information:

1. The Council of ESOT has agreed to the creation of a liver chapter or section within ESOT.

2. **Name of the section:** The European Liver Transplant Association, or ELTA. It will be constituted formally at the next ESOT meeting.

3. **Main objectives:**

- a. to provide a forum for those working in the field of liver transplantation to exchange scientific information and views related primarily to providing the best service for patients in Europe requiring liver transplantation. Thus, science, training, organ sharing and distribution, and cooperative research projects, especially of a clinical nature, and the liver registry would be of concern.
- b. the relationship with national and European government agencies and with the organ exchange organizations would also be the business of the ELTA, which would be the official representative body of liver transplantation in Europe.

4. **Meetings:**

In principle, ELTA would meet every 2 years with ESOT and at least once in between, possibly in association with some other congress with common interests.

5. **Membership:**

To become a member of ELTA (a section of ESOT), it will be necessary

- a. to already belong to ESOT as a full fee-paying member and
- b. to apply to ELTA and be ready to pay additional dues for the logistics of running ELTA.

We urge everybody interested in liver transplantation to join the association – surgeons, hepatologists, anesthesiologists, internists, radiologists, biochemists. Colleagues who are not yet members of ESOT are invited to apply to ESOT as soon as possible and, in any case, before 31 March 1993.

6. **Establishment of ELTA during the ESOT meeting in Rhodes**

A special assembly will be convened during the next ESOT meeting in Rhodes on 25–28 October 1993 in order to:

- a. elect the ELTA committee which will consist of ten members who will decide on which officers are to be appointed to the posts of chairman, secretary, registry secretary, and treasurer,
- b. decide about the by-laws of ELTA, based on a proposal that will be circulated ahead of time,
- c. decide about the ELTA membership fees.

7. **Provisional rules**

To become a founding member of ELTA in Rhodes and to have the right to vote will require that one has:

- a. been a full fee-paying member of ESOT or applied to ESOT before 31 March 1993
- b. applied to ELTA before 31 March 1993
- c. paid a provisional ELTA membership fee of 200 Austrian shillings to cover the administrative and postal costs incurred before the Rhodes meeting.

8. **Election of the ELTA committee**

The candidates to the committee will be members of the present steering committee, who should confirm their candidacy by writing to Sir Roy Calne, President of the Steering Committee, before 31 August 1993.

Other names may be put forward under the following conditions:

- a. candidates must fulfill the conditions defined above under 7 a, b, and c.
- b. each proposal should be signed by two other members of ESOT and should be sent to Sir Roy Calne before 31 August 1993.


